

The Comprehensive Labour Force Survey of Singapore was introduced in 1974 to provide reliable and timely statistical information on the labour market. The survey is designed to capture a wide range of data on the economic activities of the population, including detailed information on employment, unemployment, characteristics of the labour force and economically inactive persons. Starting from 2001, a Labour Force Survey Supplement on Training has also been conducted to capture information on the incidence and intensity of training by the Singapore labour force.

The report is divided into three parts. The first part analyses the key trends and structure of the labour force. The second part on survey methodology describes the objective, coverage, concepts and definitions, sampling design and reliability of data as well as other operational aspects of the survey. A total of 96 statistical tables are included in the third part of the report.

We hope this report will meet the needs of users for up-to-date and comprehensive labour force data. The contents and presentation of the report are reviewed regularly. We welcome readers' feedback to help us improve the report. A "Feedback Form" page is enclosed at the end of the publication for readers' use.

We wish to thank the survey respondents for their co-operation in the survey. We are also grateful to the Singapore Department of Statistics for providing the household sample for the survey.

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
