

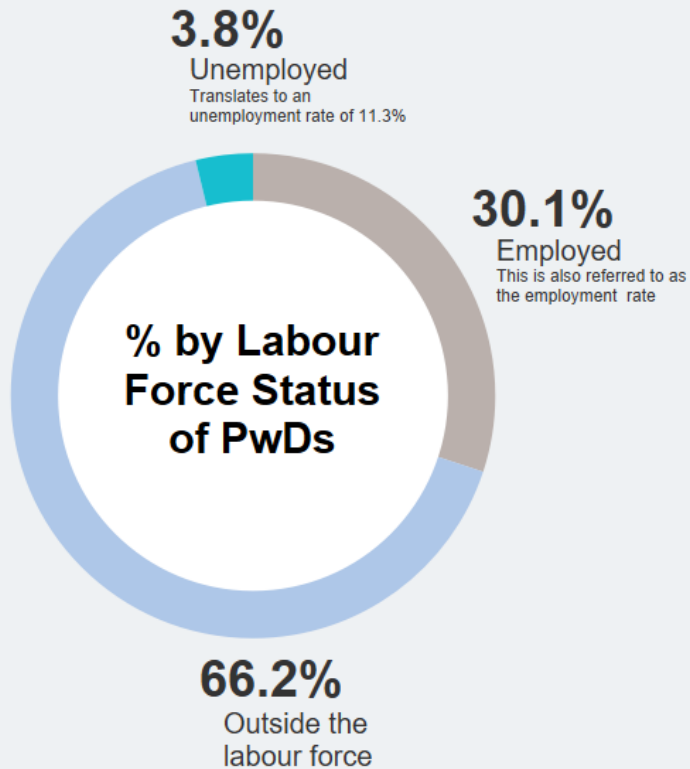


The Manpower Research and Statistics Department of the Ministry of Manpower started collecting data on the employment outcomes of Persons with Disability (PwDs) in 2018.

The information^[1] presented in this infographic was obtained from the Comprehensive Labour Force Survey, an annual sample survey of 33,000 households.

Poor health or disability were the most commonly cited reasons^[2] for being outside the labour force
